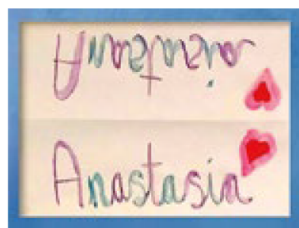

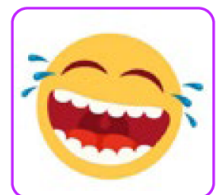

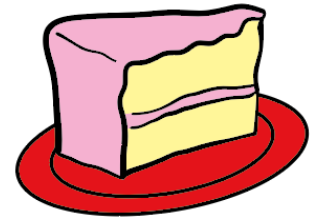

This is because many letters sound the same, like **m** and **n** or **s** and **f**, and it can be confusing when you communicate important messages.
